## **Course evaluation**

The course was taught in 7 classes of 2 hours each (total 14) hours during the second semester.

More than 30 students took the course, which is an excellent number. Unfortunately, the number of non-Erasmus (local UiB) students remained very low: only one.

Most of the students who participated previously took JUS 277-2-A (Introduction to Copyright Law).

The classes were given in a combination of lectures and discussions, based on weekly homework assignments posted on the course page on UiB Mi side.

The classes were generally well attended and produced lively discussions. However, many students did not prepare their homework.

The examination was in the form of 9 questions of which one multiple-choice; the other questions - similar in style, but not identical in content to the homework assignment – required relatively short, motivated written answers.

The distribution of grades is (mean grade B-C) is even and satisfactory, somewhat higher than the average for JUS 277-2-A, which reflects the higher commitment of the students who followed both courses consecutively.

Staff support by Mari Anne Franklin, who was new to the job, was outstanding and very pleasant.

Overall, the course seems to be working very well. An ongoing issue of concern, however, remains the very limited number of local UiB students attending the course. Another problem remains the unwillingness on the part of many students to do their homework.
